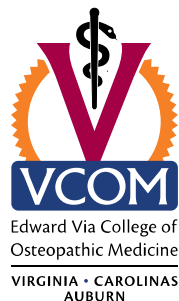

What is the NCRHW Workshop?

The National Center for Rural Health Works workshop is an interactive learning experience designed for rural healthcare leaders. Participants of the workshop will gain a better understanding of the economic impact of their healthcare sector through use of specific tools and methods developed by NCRHW for hospitals, clinics, dentists, veterinarians and EMS systems.

Gerald Doeksen, Ph.D.

Dr. Doeksen is Regents Professor/Health Economist for the Department of Agricultural Economics at Oklahoma State University. Dr. Doeksen was awarded the American Rural Health Association Research Award for developing medical-practice feasibility guidebooks and was honored by the Journal of Emergency Medical Services for his guide for planning rural EMS systems. Dr. Doeksen has worked with communities and health care providers in Oklahoma for over 35 years and co-founded the National Center for Rural Health Works.

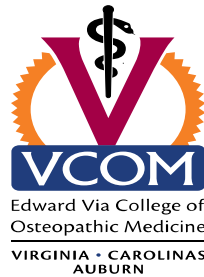
